Who Are We?



Stormwater Management in DuPage County

- Countywide program established in 1989
- Guided by the Stormwater Management Planning Committee & Plan
- Enforce the Countywide Stormwater Management & Floodplain Ordinance
- Flood Control Facilities have a floodwater capacity of nearly 6 billion gallons

- Watershed Management
- Water Quality
- Floodplain Mapping
- Regulatory Services
- Flood Control Operations & Maintenance
- Shared Services





American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)



ARPA Overview

- DuPage County received \$179.3 million in ARPA funding
- Departments and Local Agencies received shares, including Stormwater Management Department
- Flood Control and Water Quality Projects both eligible expenses
- In total, Stormwater Management Department received ~\$22,000,000 in ARPA funds

Stormwater Management ARPA Spending

- Capital Projects: ~\$20,000,000
 - DuPage County Stormwater Management Projects
 - Municipal Projects (\$8M)
 - Township Drainage Projects (\$1M)
- Consulting Contracts: ~\$1,100,000
- Staff: ~\$900,000
- Guidelines: Must meet State Revolving Loan Fund criteria, must be OBLIGATED by Dec 2025 and SPENT by Dec 2026







Program Parameters

- Allocated \$8,000,000 to this program
- 50/50 cost share or up to \$500,000 per project
- All funds must be spent by December 2024 (Shovel-Ready)
- Must meet ARPA spending criteria
- Grant application period open from February 2022 until April 2022
- Available only to DuPage County Municipalities

- Established a comprehensive Grant Funding Packet
 - Project Compliance Criteria
 - Project Prioritization Criteria & Grading Scale
 - Administrative Policies & Processes
- Created a Virtual Funding Application

Outreach

- Announced via DuPage Mayors & Managers Conference
- Sent a letter to all DuPage County municipalities
- Presented at monthly Municipal Engineers Group meeting
- Published weekly FAQs


Selections

- Received 31 applications from 18 municipalities
- Funding requests totaled \$9.6 million for projects totaling \$48.5 million
- 26 projects selected from 17 municipalities
- Total allocation \$8,090,548
- Intergovernmental Agreements (IGA) with each selected project

Progress

- 16 projects completed \$5M paid out
- 2 projects ongoing
- 8 projects scheduled for Spring 2024

ARPA Township Grant Program



Township Grant Program Parameters


- Allocated \$1,000,000
- 100% funding opportunity for qualifying expenses, up to \$100,000 per project
- All funds must be spent by December 2024 (Shovel-Ready)
- Must meet ARPA spending criteria
- Grant application period open for 30 days (August 2022 September 2022)

- Request on Letterhead from Township
- Project Compliance Criteria

Outreach

- Announced at Township Highway Commissioners Meeting
- Letter to all DuPage County Highway Commissioners

Country Club Highlands

Existing Conditions

- Longstanding drainage concerns in unincorporated Elmhurst
- Multiple homes and roadways flooded
- Existing failing & undersized infrastructure

Previous Studies

- July 2004 Wilson & Willow drainage report
- November 2005 Wilson & Willow plans
- 2005 Preliminary Engineering plans Willow & Grand
- June 2014 Crown Estates Subdivision

Implemented Solutions Fall Short

- Storm Sewer Installation wasn't enough
- Easements could not be obtained









Country Club Highlands

2019 Drainage Study

- Restudied entire subdivision
- Existing Level of Service = 5 year event
- 6 Alternatives Evaluated, focusing on SE portion of subdivision
- Replace and enhance existing failing infrastructure
- Improvements protect up to 100 year event
- No downstream impacts to Addison Creek


Public/Private Partnership

- Addison Township Highway Department
- Illinois American Water
- 3 private properties

Funding

Applied for Federal DCEO funds in 2020 – DENIED







Country Club Highlands Ph I



Final Plan

- New storm sewer on Emroy/Victory
- High Capacity Inlets at intersections (3 total)
- New 42" storm sewer connection through two side yards
- Replace 48" storm sewer
- New outlet into Addison Creek

Budget

- Estimate to Construct: ~\$1.3M
- Bid came in at \$654,000!

Enhanced Drainage Study

- Focus on Willow Ave & Crown Ave
- Existing Level of Service = 5 year event
- Flooding homes at 25 year event
- Enhance existing infrastructure
- Improvements protect up to 100 year event
- No impacts to downstream existing storm sewer

Public/Private Partnership

- Addison Township Highway Department
- Illinois American Water
- All improvements in Road Right of Way







Country Club Highlands Ph II




Final Plan

- Construct new storm sewer on Crown Ave
- Replace existing Willow Storm Sewer w/ Underground Storage
- Install new water main
- Modify sanitary services
- Tie improvements into existing downstream infrastructure

Funding

• Bid: ~\$2,700,000 - Fully funded by ARPA



Grant Tips

- Transparency is so important
- Stick to the published Grant Funding Packet
- Assemble a review team with diverse backgrounds
- Designate a leader to answer all questions, update FAQs, etc. everything grant-related goes through them
- Use existing resources (thanks Lake County SMC!)

Project Tips

- No project is too large, but have a Plan B
- Listen to/ trust the public
- Continue fostering relationships. The most gets accomplished when you are working together!

• You will have to defend your grant program and project selections, so make sure you can back up your work
