#### Update on ASFPM Foundation's 2010 Forum on Flood Risk Management

The 3rd ASFPM Foundation Forum, conducted at George Washington University in March 2010, carefully considered issues and options to establish principles and formulate a comprehensive national strategy to assess the successful management of flood risk and floodplain resources. The two-day combination of invited speakers, brainstorming, small group discussions, and group feedback resulted in four over-arching conclusions:

- More work needs to be done to arrive at a commonly accepted definition of "flood risk management." However, natural floodplain resources protection must be included.
- Too much time has been invested in communicating the complexities of flood risk on the assumption that the public will take action. A different, science-based path toward fostering appropriate behaviors is needed.
- Progress is unlikely to be made without some defined goals and indicators that show whether "success" is approaching or receding.
- A national strategy is essential to managing flood risks and floodplain resources, but most action occurs at the local level. Goals and approaches should be locally based.


