Counties Covered by Mitigation Plans	12 Counties	Represents 11% of State		
Counties with Mitigation Plans in Progress	28 Counties	Represents 27% of State		
Counties that had not started a Mitigation Plan	43 Counties	Represents 42% of State		
Counties that do not participate in the National Flood Insurance Program	17 Counties	Represents 16% of State		



Illinois Mitigation Planning Status

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

- Local jurisdictions with a DMA2k approved plan..
 (37% of State)
- Local jurisdictions that are developing DMA2k plans (39% of State)
- Local jurisdiction ineligible for PDM planning funds because they don't participate in the NFIP.

Illinois Mitigation Planning Status

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Success in Mitigation Plan

- 4 federally declared disasters in this timeframe (1771, 1800, 1826, 1850)
- -8 Declared events since 2007 (1681, 1722, 1729, 1747)
- DMA2K pre-requisites for funding
- FEMA/IEMA technical assistance to local governments
- National trend is focusing on mitigation
- Widely available funds as a result of the numerous declared events (HMGP)
- Shared interest for mitigation with agencies like IDNR, and DCEO



Also worth noting...

When dating back to 1965 we have had 32 federally declared flood events.

-Essentially this means we average .72 Flood declarations per year.

-as a point of interest, when dating back to 1993 we have had 15 flood events declared. In other words, since 1993 we average .93 flood declarations per year



Continued...

When dating back to 1965 we have had 667 federally declared counties in 32 events.

-Essentially, this means we average 15.16 declared counties per year

-as a point of interest, when dating back to 1993 we have had 354 declared counties in 15 events. We average 22.125 declared counties per year since 1993



State Goals...

- Fund Mitigation Plans in each Illinois County
- Reduce # of Repetitive Loss Structures
- Establish solid GIS data
- Coordinate new project development
